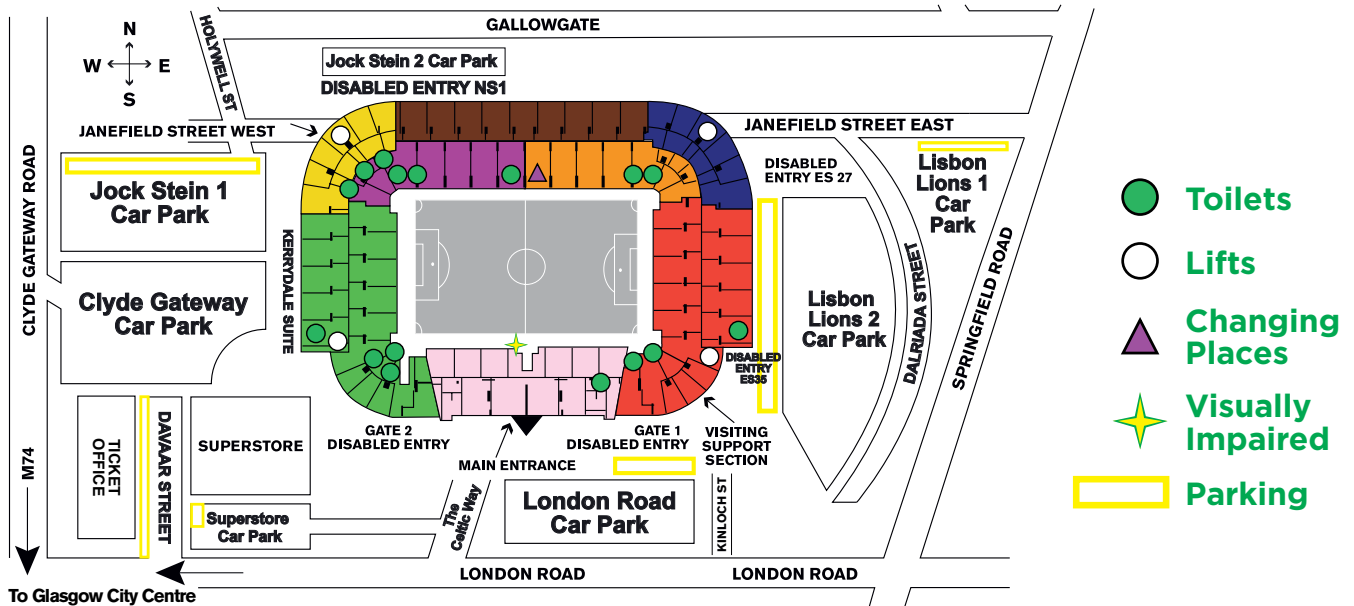


GETTING TO CELTIC PARK



Motorway exit from North/South

Visitors coming from the north or south by motorway can follow the M74 or M73 and the M74 (East) then take the A74 exit toward Tollcross/ Rutherglen. At the roundabout take the 3rd exit onto Fullarton Rd/London Rd/A74, and proceed for another mile or so along London Road to the ground on your right.

Motorway exit from East/West

Visitors from the East or West can exit at M8 junctions 12, 13, and 14.

Trains from Queen Street Station

Trains from Queen Street to Bellgrove put you approximately 1 mile from the stadium.

Trains from Glasgow City Centre

Trains from Glasgow Central or Argyle Street to Dalarnock and Bridgeton take you to within half a mile of the Stadium.

Buses from Glasgow City Centre

From Glasgow City Centre, the Nos. 2, 61, 64, 255 and 240 buses stop at the Forge Shopping Centre located on the Gallowgate. Please alight here where you will be approximately 1 mile from the Stadium.

From Glasgow Airport

Glasgow Airport is approximately 12 miles from Celtic Park. You can catch the 500 Airport Express bus from stance 1 and this will take you to the City Centre. From there you can connect to a bus or train to Celtic Park.

Parking

The Celtic Disabled Supporters Association (CDSA) allocate all parking spaces for away supporters who are blue badge holders. The spaces are located behind London Road Car Park (as shown on the map and attached picture) You enter the car park via Springfield Road and Janefield Street where stewards will be on hand to assist. Away supporters should email parking@celticdsa.co.uk or call 07514059870 at least 72 hours prior to kick-off. Do you provide storage for wheelchairs?

We have wheelchairs available to borrow for supporters who require assistance on a match day. If you are looking to store your own wheelchair please email dao@celticfc.co.uk for assistance.

Where are the accessible toilets located?

The green circles on the enclosed map show where the accessible toilets are located within the Stadium. There is now a Changing Places facility located in the North Stand, marked on the map with a purple triangle. If you require the use of this, please email dao@celticfc.co.uk or speak to an Accessibility Steward on the day and we can arrange access.

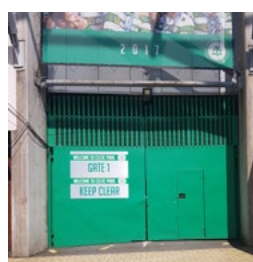


Away supporters who are wheelchair users will be located in area 120 of the South East Corner of the Stadium as shown below. There are accessible toilets and food kiosks located close to the wheelchair platform.



Is there a club shop on site?

Yes there is a club superstore located at the Celtic Way which is open 7 days a week, including post-match on a home match day. The superstore has automatic doors, a low level serving counter and staff on hand to assist. On a non-matchday there are accessible parking bays available in the superstore car park.



Accessible Entrance - Entry Gate 1

This provides access to the accessible seating area for away supporters. Accessibility Stewards will be on hand to assist.

Accessibility Stewards

We have dedicated Accessibility Stewards and these can be identified by high visibility jackets marked "Disabled Assist" on the back. The Accessibility Stewards will be on hand before, during and after the game to ensure you make the most of your matchday experience



Do you have audio descriptive commentary (ADC) available

UNACCEPTABLE CONDUCT

Celtic Football Club will not tolerate unacceptable conduct at Celtic Park. Unacceptable conduct is conduct which is violent or disorderly. Violent conduct includes any actual, attempted or threatened physical violence against any person, or intentional damage to property.

Disorderly conduct includes:

Conduct which stirs up or sustains, or is likely, or is designed to stir up and sustain hatred or ill will against or towards individuals or groups of people because of:-

- Gender, colour, race, nationality (including citizenship) or ethnic or national origin
- Membership or presumed membership, of a religious group or of a social or cultural group with perceived membership or presumed membership, of a religious group or of a religious affiliation
- Sexual orientation
- Transgender identity
- Disability
